Long term goals are finally becoming reality! Over the past three years I have led museum stakeholders through three major professional assessments. In November of 2008 the American Association of Museums supported an Institutional Assessment and in January of 2009 Heritage and Preservation funded a comprehensive conservation assessment for the Museum's permanent collection and last year we spent three months involved in an audience assessment supported by a grant from the state arts council. We have also focused on reaching out, and enhancing our reputation within Louisiana and throughout the United States through our traveling exhibitions and loans from the permanent collection. This fall we begin a year long self-study as part of the accreditation process of the American Association of Museums. This important goal is a benchmark in my eight years as Director for the Paul and Lulu Hilliard University Art Museum.

I am most encouraged by the continued support and involvment, by not only our community members and patrons, but the University faculty and administrative leadership. The Hilliard continues to use existing artistic and intellectual capital of the Museum and University of Louisiana at Lafayette to establish the Museum as a vital resource for University students, educators, families, youth and life-long learners in Acadiana.

The exhibitions, programs and announcments presented in this issue of VIEWFINDER illustrate that this museum has evolved into one of the most important educational resources in our great state. We not only present compelling and important artwork to south Louisiana, we also bring insightful and interesting artists and scholars to our many audiences.

All of this is possible because of our broadening base of financial support. On page five we announce a new opportunity for individuals and families to support our continued efforts through a new fund and challenge opportunity established at the Acadiana Community Foundation. Academic Enrichment Program: Another effective partnership beneficial for the Museum is our association with UL Lafayette's Academic Enrichment Program in Visual Arts. This summer over 100 middle school age youth participated in a summer art enrichment program. Teachers developed activities based on museum exhibitions and produced artwork in the Museum's A. Hays Town Building. ■



#### **Uros House**

Uros House, a site-specific, lighting sculpture installation by artist Grimanesa Amorós, is on view at the Museum from August 6th through the end of the year. Recently shown in Times Square (see above), the sculpture was presented as part of the 2011 Armory Show along with three other artists: Tom Otterness, David Kennedy Cutler, and Niki de Saint Phalle. Amorós was also invited to show at the 2011 Venice Biennale in Venice, Italy.

Uros House, made of polyethylene, steel, metal and computer controlled LEDS, was inspired by structures built by the Uros Indians in Peru. The pre-Incan Uros, who live on forty-two self-fashioned floating islands in Lake Titicaca, build everything out of totora reeds, a sub species of the giant bulrush sedge. According to Amorós, who was born and raised in Peru, the Uros House sculpture "will embody the beauty of sea foam, while maintaining the traditional technique and shape of the Uros islands houses. The structure will seemingly arise from the ground as if it were one with the earth."

Grimanesa Amorós is an interdisciplinary artist with diverse interests in the fields of social history, scientific research and critical theory, which have greatly influenced her work. She often makes use of sculpture, video, and lighting to create works that illuminate our notions of personal identity and community. Amorós was born in Lima, Peru but lives and works in New York City. ■


